Advanced Life Support (ALS)

9 + ALS + Tier 2 + 1 Anaesthetics (Emergency Response)

Delivered in a relaxed, peer-to-peer learning environment, the ALS course will equip you with both basic and advanced life support skills with a strong focus on issues that arise in rural settings. Skills include using a manual defibrillator and an automated external defibrillator, identifying and managing life threatening arrhythmias, intravenous access or intraosseous access, and administering drugs in resuscitation with correct dosage and frequency.

Mental Health Disorders Training for Rural Practitioners

8 + Mental Health - MHST 🔗

The increasing need to provide mental health support in rural communities makes this course a must-do. Topics include: depression and risk, planning, organising chronic care and comorbidity, anxiety and somatisation, patient education and support, using medication and chronic care. Delivered in person or online, participants who successfully complete the course will gain access to Medicare item numbers 2715 and 2717.

Pre-Hospital Emergency Care (PHEC)

9 + ALS + Tier 2 + 1 Anaesthetics (Emergency Response)

In this course you will learn real-world practical skills and participate in a range of emergency scenarios that you may encounter as a Rural Generalist, providing you with the skills required in preparing for patient care situations outside the clinic or hospital. PHEC is run outdoors to provide a realistic experience and help consolidate skills required when working in unfamiliar or uncomfortable environments.

Rural Anaesthetic Crisis Management (RACM)



RACM includes technical and nontechnical skills with a focus on team communication and improving anaesthetic emergency skills for clinicians practicing in rural and remote environments. Based on the ANZCA emergency response activities, RACM walks participants through the current guidelines and reviews pharmacological options and considerations.
